

C7445 S6 Coroners Officer

Role Description

Investigate and administer, promptly and exhaustively, all sudden, un-natural deaths and treasure trove, which occur within the Coroners area of jurisdiction, working in conjunction with and on behalf of the Coroner and the Police.

Main Responsibilities

- Receive reports of sudden and/ un-natural deaths, especially those which may have occurred in suspicious circumstances; visit scene of death where the body is still in situ and ensure identification of the body is conducted by a relative or a friend.
- Notify the Coroner of all cases making sure that he/ she is informed of all relevant details; liase with Detectives if there is any possibility of criminal investigation.
- Establish the deceased's medical history, obtain witness statements from family and friends, etc and discuss the case with the family doctor to establish whether a certificate for the causes of death can be issued.
- Arrange for the body to be removed to the mortuary, take possession of the deceased's property and catalogue the
 details, organise a post mortem, identifying the body to the Pathologist ensuring he/ she is aware of the
 circumstances of the death and take possession of any organ/ sample taken by the Pathologist to enable HM
 Coroner to arrange analysis.
- Inform relatives of the cause of death, arrange for the body to be released to the Undertaker, and organise the
 inquest, notifying all interested parties, summon Jurors and arrange for witness to attend, in order to establish how
 the death occurred.
- Perform a range of duties at court hearings for expenses payments for Jurors, witnesses and, collating reports on the case as required by the Coroner/ issuing certificates, to ensure that cases proceed smoothly and facilitate the prompt conclusion of the case.
- To assist with urgent enquiries from medical organisations for consent to take organs for transplant purposes by obtaining authorisation from H.M. Coroner.
