Role Description

To provide a high profile, high visibility presence within a designated sector to support and assist regular officers in the delivery of an effective service to local communities.

Main Responsibilities

- To respond appropriately to calls and requests for assistance, investigating the circumstances, calling for specialist assistance as and when required and resolving incidents as appropriate.
- To participate in intelligence led pro-active policing of the sector, building on local knowledge, observation and targeting in order to support local and force initiatives.
- To pursue opportunities to make contact and build relationships with all sections of the community to promote and enhance local problem solving and to support voluntary effort in dealing with crime, disorder and other quality of life issues of local concern.
- To compile concise accurate reports and other prosecution files in accordance with codes of practice and relevant legislation.
- To drive a police vehicle safely with consideration for others in accordance with Force policy & in line with the system of car control.
- To contribute to maintaining road safety by identifying and responding to hazards, regulating traffic, dealing with traffic offences and attending collision scenes in accordance with legislation and Force policy.
- To prepare and present case materials and attend court as required.
- To provide the necessary first aid treatment in accordance with approved procedures.
- To carry out arrest /process procedures in accordance with the relevant legal requirements & policy, having regard for human rights, security, health & safety of person(s) detained, members of the public, colleagues & self.
- To conduct search procedures on person(s), vehicles and land in accordance with the relevant legislation and policy, whilst having regard for the health, safety and Human Rights.
